# Am I actually going?

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Monday morning after week 4 events (March 24<sup>th</sup>) Adrienne Collins will send an email to all teams that have qualified for District Championships

- The window to register is small, we ask that teams be registered for District Championships by **3:00 pm Wednesday, March 26<sup>th</sup>**.
  - It is critical you monitor your email even if you are on spring break. We do not have time to chase you down, if you do not register by 3:00 pm March 26<sup>th</sup>, we will go to the next team on the list!
- If you do **not** plan to attend, please fill out the registration form ASAP noting that so we can invite the next team on the list as soon as possible.

Good news, your District Championship registration fee is covered by the fee that you paid to *FIRST* Washington so there is no additional charge.

### **Accommodations at District Champs**

If your team has qualified for District Championships and you need an event accommodation, please fill out our <u>accommodation form</u> (If you have already filled out the form, then no need to fill it out again.) This form is not for hotel rooms, it is for special accommodations at the event like ADA seating. This will help us to see what accommodations are needed and do our best to meet everyone's needs.

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### Load in Process – Day 0 prior to 5 pm

• You will need to register for a load in time. (Everyone who is registered will be sent a load in registration link on Wed, 3-26)

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Prior to 5:00 pm, your team will be allowed to:

• Load in their robot and pit equipment

Teams will **not** be allowed to:

- Safety glasses are mandatory.

### **Logistics: Parking at EWU**


**FIRST** 

The lots behind the stadium are free

Trailers and large vehicles can be parked in the upper lot (by the red arrow) Be sure your tires are chalked

Busses may also use this lot

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# **Safety Glasses**

- There will be a sign-up sheet at pit admin for safety glass table coverage. To check in, your team will need to sign up for a time slot at the safety glass table.
- Teams are expected to provide safety glasses for their team members and spectators to use in the pits
- The safety glasses FIRST Washington brings are for special guests, not for teams or spectators affiliated with teams



### What you should bring to check in

Team Rosters with all your STIMS information to EACH of your events (including handwritten consent forms for anyone not listed on your TIMS roster) – The expectation is that your students/mentors have registered online, please only bring printed rosters for those who absolutely can't get registered online

All cords should be labeled with your team number on BOTH ends so we can figure out what plugs in where.

#### You MUST BRING YOUR OWN SAFETY GLASSES

- For your entire team, parents, mentors and **visitors**
- We will not have safety glasses on site for participants or spectators

You must bring

- 1 each 15' extension cord 16ga or 14 ga
- 1 each 40' extension cord 16ga or 14 ga
- 1 6 outlet power strip
- 1 each 2' x 2' x <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> " Plywood pounding board







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### **Inspection Process**

Be ready! Use the inspection sheet

As soon as you can, bring your robot to the inspection station for size and weight check.

After your robot has been weighed and sized, if ready, put your team number on the inspection request list.

The first available inspector will come to your pit to complete your inspection

- It is rare for a robot to pass on the first attempt. It is an iterative process.
  - Inspection time at district (first visit) ~ 30 40 minutes
  - Average Number of visits at district: 3
- If you do not pass, fix your problems and then put your team back on the inspection request list.

#### **Finish Early**

Be through with inspection by 10:00 am Thursday, Day 1!



# Arriving

You will be required to stand outside or in designated areas until the facility opens to the public

If you happen to find a door that is open and it is **before** the posted pits open time, please show Gracious Professionalism and remain outside or in a designated staging area until the pit opening time. We are working hard to get things ready for your team to have a great event and don't want to have to spend out time policing teams who attempt to enter early.



### **Pit Etiquette**

Chairs are allowed withing the confines of your pits (unless there is an area specifically designated), please do not place chairs in the robot aisles between pits (or anywhere in the pits)

No running in the pits!! We know that sometimes your students need to move quickly but it is a hazzard to run in the pits!

Our venues will have power cord covers (aka Yellow Jackets)

• Our yellow jackets are 2" tall

Your FRC robot cart MUST have > 3" diameter wheels

- Wheels must be in good working order. No damaged or stuck wheels. Soft rubber. No hard plastic or steel tread wheels.
- Maximum weight for your carts, tool boxes, etc will be 50 lbs per inch of wheel size (1 cart, 4 x 3" wheels, 600lbs max)

All wheels must be non marking rubber or synthetic wheels

• No steel wheels. No sharp wheels.



### Who to bring on Day 0 evening

You really want your core robot builders and mentors who will help the team get through in inspecion on Wednesday evening.

Depending on your team's logistics, you might consider having a partial team on Day 0 evening and the whole team starting Day 1 afternoon



### Machine Shop Open: 9 am Day 1

We have a volunteer machine shop onsite to help you fabricate replacement parts.

The shop has small mills, lathes, and various other tools.

ONLY AUTHORIZED MACHINE SHOP VOLUNTEERS MAY USE THESE TOOLS!

We have excellent volunteer machinists. However, there are limits to what they can do for your team.

We have a TIG welder.

The machine shop has request forms for your team. It will be located near the loading ramp on the arena floor.

In general, the machine shop will NOT loan you tools.

### Drivers Meeting at 8:30 am Day 1

- The Drivers Meeting is scheduled for 8:30 am Day 1
- Drive Team members will remain in the stands for the Drivers Meeting

**FIRST** 

• Q & A will be handled the same way as last year

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- Pit Admin will have a paper Q & A form
- Team members can fill out the form with their questions and turn them in at Pit Admin

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- The deadline to turn in forms is 8:10 am Day 1
- Forms turned in after 8:10 am Day 1 may not be addressed at the drivers meeting but you can always stand in the question box to get your questions answered



### **Practice Rounds**

Practice matches are scheduled and will run 10:00 am to 12:30 pm (The FTA will go over whether there will be a practice match schedule or not.)

You do not have to pass inspection to run in your scheduled practice match.

It is very common for teams not to be ready for their scheduled match in the mornings. We will accept inspected teams on a first come/first served basis who wish to take an unscheduled practice round. Check in with the Lead Queuer to get on the list.

Priority will always be given to teams scheduled and/or teams who have not been on the field at least once. Be gracious and professional if you get bumped for a higher priority team.

Just a reminder, you need to be through inspection to use any of the practice fields



### Thursday afternoon (Day 1)

Matches will start at 1:30 pm Thursday afternoon

Queueing will begin at 1:15 pm sharp

We will have no opening ceremony that day so if you are in an early round, be prepared to play at 1:30 pm Thursday.



# Logistics: Food

Concessions will be open. We are still confirming the days & times with the venue.

Participants will be allowed to bring in food

- No food allowed in the pits
- You may eat in event seats, hallway between comp area and pits & courtyard outside.
- You may set up a table at this venue to serve lunch to your teams from **but you must take it down every day.** Remember, we are at a public venue that is also open to the public during our event, please take down your tables and don't make more work for the volunteers at the end of the evening. Also please remember there are 49 other teams looking for table space so be considerate of the amount of space you take up for your team
- Please do not bring crock pots to plug in, it can create power issues and even if it does not at a specific venue, we can't accommodate 50 teams wanting power for crockpots.



### **Menstrual Equity & Quiet Rooms**

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

### Load OUT

Move *all* your packed gear to the specified holding area near pit exterior door

Driver proceeds to load out area – please ensure that adequate personnel are available to haul gear when vehicle arrives!

The driver should be in the vehicle during load out. No cars should be parked in the load out area



**FIRST** 

The PNW has been allocated 22 slots at the World Championships in Houston

Advancing to World Championships will be

- 2 FIRST Impact award teams
- 2 Engineering Inspiration teams
- 1 Rookie All Star team
- Winning Alliance

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 14 teams based on their total district qualification points (or 13 if winning alliance has 4<sup>th</sup> alliance partner)

Qualcom

As individuals, we are sending:

- 4 Dean's List Finalists
- 2 Woodie Flowers Finalists

Teams will be responsible for the \$5,750 registration fee

- Payment is made to *FIRST* Washington
- · Dean's list and Woodie Flowers Finalists have no registration fee
- Engineering Inspiration teams WILL NOT NASA funding this year

### **Registering for Championships in Houston**

FIRST.

The registration process has changed from prior years.

• Advancing teams will be announced at PNW District Championships (provided the District Ranking software is up and running)

Qualcom

- You will have the opportunity to fill out the Smartsheet at District Championships so FIRST Washington can secure your Championship registration. You can fill out the form at Pit Admin after the awards ceremony is completed. Because we secure registration and bill teams, you **MUST** fill out our form (so why not just do it at the event!)
- From what I understand on Sunday, April 6, the Lead and Alternate Coach will be sent an email prompting them to register for Championships. It is important you fill this out ASAP. If you are not attending, please email me to let me know.
  - The registration form will need to be filled no later than 5:00 pm EDT Tuesday, April 8th
  - FIRST Washington will invoice you and you will need to secure your registration by Friday, April 12.
  - You can secure with a PO, check or credit card



### Hotels for World Championships

As I understand it, on Sunday, April 6, the Lead Contact Only will receive an email from FIRST Inspires with the link to secure hotels.

If the Lead Contact is **not** the correct person, there is a process to transfer that role to someone else. **Do not just forward the email to the person in charge of making your hotel arrangements, the link is specific to one person.** 

There are very specific rules about securing hotels (and with our event being week 6, the window is very small to get your hotel rooms secured) Please make sure you know the rules around booking hotel rooms in Houston. That has been sent out in several blogs, you can read the blogs <u>here</u>



**FIRST** 

You have 3 options to get your robot to Houston this year:

- 1. Shipping your robot on a dedicated trailer from either the FIRST Washinton Fieldhouse or Wilsonville High School
- 2. Hand Cary your robot to the competition (either on the plane with you or in a private vehicle)
- 3. Ship the standard way via FedEx

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You will receive an email communication from FIRST asking how you plan to transport your robot



### Shipping via dedicated FedEx Trailer

FIRST will once again be offering to ship robots direct to Houston from Wilsonville HS or the FIRSTWA Fieldhouse in Kent.

Teams can choose to bring their crated robot either to the FIRST Washington fieldhouse in Kent or Wilsonville High School to be shipped to Houston. The crates will be picked up at both locations on **April 9. M**ore info will be sent to interested teams after they qualify.

Same weight and packing rules apply.

Robot crate **must** be able to be offloaded with a forklift. **Plan accordingly!** 

Using this method to ship your robot is not required. If you do not live close to either drop off location, you can ship your robot the traditional way.

Note: This is for robots only, not for your pit shipping

### Pick up from FedEx

Fill out the form FIRST sends you letting them know you plan to ship your robot the traditional way then they will send you the paperwork you need.

Please note: Form needs to be completed no later than Monday, April 7<sup>th</sup> and robot needs to be shipped by no later than Tuesday, April 8<sup>th</sup>.

### Hand carry your robot

Fill out the form FIRST sends you letting them know you plan to hand carry your robot and follow their instructions

### **HOUSTON - PIT SHIPMENT**

- Team 360 has secured an RXO Express 53 foot trailer
- Contact: Dan Taylor (206) 571-0062 (cell) <u>dan.taylor@nventure.com</u>
- Total Cost: \$15,400
- Estimated \$800 for a 4x4 spot. This is dependent on # of spaces secured at PNW Championships
- We will sell additional space as it is available in 2x4 sections for approximately \$400
- Team 360 will generate an invoice for each team who secures a spot
- Forms of payment are CHECK made out to Bellarmine Prep Robotics or TRANSFER of funds to Team 360's FIRST WA booster account
- Payment must be made prior to departure

### **HOUSTON - PIT CONTAINMENT**

- Pit contents MUST BE labeled with your team number
- Pit contents MUST BE contained (i.e. Shrink Wrap all stacked items)
- Pit contents CANNOT exceed 8 feet in height
- Pit carts MUST BE able to roll on and off the truck
- Pit carts MUST USE 5 inch Heavy Duty Caster locking wheels to avoid your load from shifting and wheels from breaking during the trip
- Longer items, like poles and tubes, will be allowed but must be wrapped together and labeled with your team number
