

Preparing for your League Tournament

- Please make sure to bring your team roster, which should include
 - Your coaches & mentors
 - Your student participants
- Make sure to also bring your engineering portfolio and/or other supporting documentation for judging
 - This can include previous iterations of your robot or prototypes





What else should you bring?

- Safety glasses
- Robot and batteries
- Tools and repair supplies
- Everything required to drive the robot
- Power strip (in case you need more than 1 outlet)
- Extension cord
- Safety glasses
- Patience and Gracious Professionalism

Dean's List

- Each team can nominate up to 2 students in the 10th or 11th grade as Dean's List Semi-finalists
 - Nominations consist of a mentor-submitted essay and then an interview with nominated students
 - More information at: <u>Dean's List | FIRST Tech Challenge</u>
- Essay submissions are due December 15th at 11:59PM EST
 - We highly recommend submitting at least a day ahead of the deadline in case issues arise
- Interviews will be held remotely over Teams between Monday January 12th and Sunday January 25th
 - No interviews will be held the weekend of the Super Qualifiers (January 17th & 18th)
 - The interview window may be shortened to Monday January 19th through the 25th, we will know the week of December 15th





Dean's List Process for Teams

- 1. Mentors submit nomination essays by December 15th
- 2. FIRST Washington will email student schedules to coaches the first week in January
 - o If there are scheduling conflicts, try to resolve them between the nominees on your team(s) first
 - Please reply to the email confirming your schedule if it works for your students!
- 3. FIRST Washington will email student remote interview meeting links the second week in January
- 4. Please share the interview schedule and link with your students, FIRST Washington can communicate with coaches only! It is your responsibility to pass on the information.
 - TIP: Remind your students this award is about them and not the team. Interviewers want to hear about their individual contributions, efforts, successes, and leadership.

- 5. 4 Finalists will be announced at the FTC Washington State Championships on January 31st









Judging Changes

- Motivate Award removed
- Two new awards added:
 - Sustain: Celebrates a team who plans for and makes steps towards long-term success
 - o **Reach**: Celebrates a team who has sparked others to embrace the *FIRST culture*
- Award language/criteria updated across existing awards

Judging Process for Teams - Structured Interviews

- The interview schedule will be created as teams check-in
- Teams need at least 2 students, and can have 1 optional silent adult observer and/or 1 optional support person to fill accommodation needs in the judge room
- Bring a printed copy of your portfolio (optional), any "show & tell" demonstration items like the robot (encouraged, but optional)
- Leave the Portfolio with the Judges
 - Will be returned at the end of the day
- All teams receive 10 minutes of dedicated time
 - Up to 5 minutes for uninterrupted prepared presentation to the judges (encouraged, but optional)
 - At least 5 additional minutes of open-ended questions from the judges
- Each team will be asked the same first two questions during the open-ended question period





Judging Process for Teams - Pit Interviews

- After initial deliberation, judges will come to your pit with further questions for your team
- Help the judges by keeping at least 1-2 team members in your pit whenever possible
- For all of our events, judges will be in a different color volunteer shirt.
 - Please watch for them
 - If you're busy they can come back later, but they have a limited amount of time





Judging Tips

- Read <u>Section 6 Awards</u> in the Game Manual carefully as the language has been updated this season
- Teams are judged on their accomplishments during the current season as presented at the current event
- Information taken into consideration for judging is limited to information shared during the structured interview and pit interview(s), match observation, and information documented in the portfolio
- Portfolios are not required for some awards but carry equal weight to what the team has discussed, displayed, or demonstrated to the Judges for those awards
- Feedback Forms are based solely on the content of the initial interview
- Teams have access to all <u>Judge/JA volunteer information</u>. Especially useful:
 - o <u>Judging Question Bank</u>
 - Outreach Terms and Definitions
 - o <u>Judge Summary Sheet</u>
- Each set of judges sees only a few teams the judges you see will be your advocates in the Judge room. Help them by giving them the information they need!
